Topic: Unit 4: What do Christians believe about forgiveness? Link with Easter



Essential Core (Summary Of Unit)

- I will recognise the order of key events in the Biblical narrative and understand that Christians believe that because Jesus died, they can be **forgiven** by God
- I will understand that Christians believe that Jesus rose from the dead, giving hope of a new life

What should I already Know?

- The Bible is an important book to Christians, it is also known as the Holy Book
- Christians believe that Jesus is the son of God
- God created the world in 6 days and on the 7th he rested
- Christians prayer to God to say thank you, that they love God and that they are sorry
- Prayer can happen anywhere and at anytime



Important Facts

- The Bible is made up of lots of different books each with their own name: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John are some examples.
- **Parables** are important to Christians because they believe they are stories told by Jesus and it tells them how they should live their lives.
- **Easter** is the most important time of the year for Christians.
- Palm Sunday, The Last Supper, Peter's betrayal, the Crucifixion and the **Resurrection** on Easter Sunday are important events during the Easter period
