What should I already Know?

1. Use voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes
2. Play tuned and un-tuned instruments musically
3. Listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music
4. Experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Musical Skills and Theory

Listen & Appraise

Find the pulse as you are listening to the music:

Dance, move, sway with your friends

Instruments/voices you can hear: Keyboard, drums, bass, a female singer, a glockenspiel

Musical Activities

Find the pulse! You can decide how to find the pulse! **Clapping Rhythms** - Clap the rhythm of your name/favourite colour; Make up your own rhythms **Singing** in two-parts

Playing instruments using up to three notes – C or E and G.

Improvise using the notes C + D

Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms, choosing from the notes C + D or C, D or E.

Perform and Share

Introduce your performance to your audience.
Can you include some funky moves? How will you record it?

Vocabulary

Rhythm	Follows the patterns of words – it is often different to the pulse.
Pulse	The steady beat felt throughout the music
Pitch	The “volume” of music
Improvise	Make up a tune and play it on the spot.
Compose	Creating and developing music ideas.
Perform	Singing and playing instruments
Audience	Who you perform to.
Melody	The tune
Dynamics	How loud or quiet music is
Tempo	The speed of the pulse.
